

1. With no runners on base, which umpire is responsible for a fair/foul decision with the first baseman fielding the ball in the cut out - 1-foot in front of first base?
  - A. HP Umpire
  - B. First base umpire
  - C. Third base umpire
  
2. With a runner on first base only, which umpire will the HP umpire go to for help on a left-handed batter for a check swing?
  - A. HP Umpire
  - B. First base umpire
  - C. Third base umpire
  
3. With no runners on base, which umpire is responsible for a play on the Batter-Runner at third base, assuming that no umpires have “gone out” on the play?
  - A. HP Umpire
  - B. First base umpire
  - C. Third base umpire
  
4. With no runners on base, which umpire is responsible for a “routine” catch - with the center fielder coming straight-forward towards the infield?
  - A. HP Umpire
  - B. First base Umpire
  - C. Third base umpire
  
5. With a runner on first base only and a “double-play” ball hit within the infield (stays in the infield), when does the first base umpire rotate home?
  - A. When the HP umpire goes to 3<sup>rd</sup>.
  - B. When the runner on first commits to third base
  - C. You do not rotate in this situation
  
6. If an umpire decides to go for help on any play (not including check swings), which other members of the crew should join the requesting umpire?
  - A. A maximum of one other umpire
  - B. Only the umpire who would most likely have the best information
  - C. All members of the crew
  
7. With a runner on third base and a ground ball in the infield, which answer is most correct?
  - A. The home plate umpire must be prepared for a play at the plate and getting into position to judge runner’s lane interference.
  - B. After a play at the plate, the call of runner’s lane interference will be the primary responsibility of the first base umpire.
  - C. The home plate umpire should take all plays in this situation third base line extended
  
8. With a runner on third base only and less than two outs. If a “routine” fly-ball is hit into the first base umpire’s area, who will be responsible for a play on the batter-runner at second base?
  - A. U1 will take the batter-runner into second and give the catch/no catch in the outfield to the HP umpire
  - B. U1 will take the batter-runner into second and be responsible for the catch/no catch in the outfield.

9. With 2 outs, a runner on first base only: a routine fly ball to right center field - which statement below is not correct.
  - A. The first base umpire observes the action and base touch at first on the batter-runner. Once

R1 touches second base and commits to third base, U1 moves to the plate for any play there.

- B. The third base umpire rules on the catch/no catch. U3 moves into position for all plays on R1 at second base and all plays on the batter-runner at first and second base.
- C. Since this a routine fly ball, the first base umpire will stay on the first base line and watch the catch in right center field and be prepared for any play back into first base. The home plate umpire will watch the batter-runner touch first base.

10. Regarding instant replay; Bases loaded, followed by a base hit and a very close call of out/safe on R2 at home, goes to instant replay - which statement is correct?

- A. If during the replay, it is revealed by the replay official that the runner, who is involved in the judgment at home plate, was obstructed going around third base, this obstruction may be considered in determining the out/safe at home plate.
